

PREFACE

This report documents the results of a state-by-state analysis of spending by the U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) during Fiscal Year 2016 in the 50 states and the District of Columbia. The findings are presented in graphs and tables, and include a range of indicators, such as the total spending figures, the categories of goods and services on which funds were spent, the major defense vendors, and the numbers of defense personnel. The report may be used as a source of information and statistics on links between defense spending and a state's economy, particularly in relation to defense-related employment and industry, as well as how defense spending received by a state compares with other states.

Conducted between December 2017 and June 2018, the analysis primarily entailed an examination of DoD prime and sub-contract award data and of defense personnel and payroll figures. This report's findings are drawn from numerous sources, including the DoD's Defense Manpower Data Center; the U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of Economic Analysis and Census Bureau; and USASpending.gov, which is managed by the U.S. Department of the Treasury.

The DoD Office of Economic Adjustment worked with the Federal Research Division within the Library of Congress to produce this report. The analysts involved were Katarina David, Wm. Noël Ivey, Alan Stone, and Colin Wood.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In Fiscal Year (FY) 2016, government-wide spending caps and continuing resolutions combined to create budget uncertainty for the Department of Defense (DoD), impacting the military, as well as the states and communities where bases and companies that produce goods and services for our nation's defense reside. After the FY 2000 through 2010 increase, the drawdown of troops in Iraq and Afghanistan and the Budget Control Act of 2011 forced significant reductions in DoD's budget authority and outlays (the amount actually spent in a given year). In FY 2016, DoD's budget authority rose from \$570.8 billion to \$595.7 billion; however, the real value of DoD's outlays continued to decline by -0.2%.¹ In addition, a final appropriations bill was not signed into law until December 18 – 79 days after the start of the fiscal year.

Background and Methodology

This report provides an overview of the linkages between defense spending and the economies of the 50 states and the District of Columbia for FY 2016. It highlights factors such as the reliance of regions on military bases and private contractors, which can be used to assess potential exposure to fluctuations in defense spending and to target assistance to create more resilient communities and companies. The contractual data for this report was obtained from USASpending.gov. Since an obligation can take several years to complete and may require parts or services from multiple subcontractors, the raw data was adjusted for the place of performance of subawards and the length of prime contracts. The payroll data and personnel counts used in this report come from DoD's Defense Manpower Data Center. These reflect gross pay over the course of the fiscal year for all active duty, civilian, National Guard, and Reserve personnel in the 50 states and the District of Columbia.² This is a change from the Defense Spending by State Fiscal Year 2015 report, which reflected personnel levels as of the end of FY 2015, not cumulative totals. While generally higher than a point-intime snapshot of personnel levels, the cumulative totals allow the reader to see how many people earned the gross pay reported for a state or locality. More details on the methodology and sources of data can be found in appendix 2.

Overview

In FY 2016, DoD spent \$378.5 billion on contracts and payroll in all 50 states and the District of Columbia, approximately \$1,171 per U.S. resident. This spending accounted for 2.0 percent of the country's gross domestic product (GDP) in 2016, and was lower as a share of GDP than the \$383.3 billion spent in FY 2015.

Of these funds, \$258.2 billion (68 percent) was spent on contracts for various products and services, while the remaining \$120.3 billion (32 percent) paid the salaries of DoD personnel. Most contract spending went to supplies and equipment (49 percent) or services (39 percent). The remainder supported research and development (9 percent) or construction (3 percent). Personnel pay was nearly evenly split between active duty military (50 percent) and civilians (45 percent), with the remaining 5 percent spent on pay for those in the National Guard and the Reserves.

With regard to total defense spending by state, funding varied from \$313.2 million in Vermont to \$48.8 billion in California, averaging \$7.4 billion per state. Almost 60 percent of that funding (\$223.8 billion) went to 10 states (see Table 1).

However, if this funding is examined as a component of the states' economies, a slightly different picture emerges. On average, defense spending accounted for 2.2 percent of all states' GDP in FY 2016, ranging from 0.5 percent in Illinois to 8.5 percent in Virginia. The defense spending of \$4.0 billion in Illinois, for example, was a small portion of its \$799 billion GDP, while Virginia's \$42.7 billion in defense spending accounted for a relatively larger segment of its \$500.8 billion GDP. The ten states with the highest defense spending as a percent of state GDP are enumerated in Table 2.

When reviewing the state totals in terms of defense contract and personnel spending, it is apparent that some states received substantial funds for both categories, while some states received relatively high amounts for either contracts or personnel. For instance, 10 states received 62 percent (\$160.8 billion) of all defense contract spending, most of which were also among the top 10 recipients of defense spending overall. Of the top ten states by defense contract spending, only two—Arizona and Massachusetts—

were not among the top ten states by overall defense spending (see Table 3).

Similarly, some of the states that received the highest totals of defense personnel spending (e.g., Colorado, Hawaii, and North Carolina) were not among the top recipients overall (see Table 4).

SUMMARY TABLE

How to Read and Use the Information in This Table

This table showcases U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) contract and personnel spending data for all 50 states and the District of Columbia (listed alphabetically) in fiscal year (FY) 2016, which can be used to provide information and statistics about various topics, such as:

- The importance of defense spending for a state's economy (Columns 1 and 3).
- How that spending compares to other states and the country overall (Columns 2, 10, and 11).
- The association between defense spending and a state's economic reliance on defense-related employment and industries (Columns 4–9).

The columns show the following variables:

- 1. Defense Spending as a Share of GDP identifies the total amount of defense spending (i.e., contracts and payroll) per state as a share of that state's GDP. This provides an understanding of the degree to which a state's economic health depends on such funding and how vulnerable a state is to DoD spending changes.
- 2. State Share of Total U.S. Defense Spending calculates each state's share of total defense spending (i.e., contract spending and payroll in the 50 states plus the District of Columbia), which helps to identify the largest and smallest recipients of DoD funding.
- 3. Defense Spending per Resident is the amount DoD spent per resident in a state or the District of Columbia on defense contracts and payrolls. Like "Defense

- Spending as a Share of GDP," it shows a state's relative dependence on and vulnerability to change in this type of support.
- 4. Total Contract and Payroll Spending is the sum of all DoD payroll and contract spending in a state or the District of Columbia.
- **5. Total Contract Spending** shows the amount DoD spent on contracts in a given state or the District of Columbia.
- 6. Total Payroll is the gross pay received by active duty, civilian, National Guard, or Reserve personnel with an assigned or duty location in a state or the District of Columbia during FY 2016. These figures, as well as those in columns 7–9, do not include benefits for current or former defense personnel.
- **7. Civilian Pay** shows the total gross pay to DoD civilian personnel in FY 2016.
- Military Active Duty Pay equals the total gross pay to active duty personnel in FY 2016.
- National Guard & Reserve Pay refers to the total gross pay received by National Guard or Reserve personnel in FY 2016.
- 10. Ranking by Defense Spending as a Share of State GDP indicates a state's placement among the 51 profiles with respect to the total amount of defense spending (i.e., contracts and payroll) as a share of that state's GDP.
- 11. Ranking by Total Defense Spending likewise indicates a state's placement among the 51 profiles. Detailed information on the methodology for these statistics is included in appendix 2.

The following information briefly describes the statistics listed in the state profiles throughout this report. A listing of military installations by state and county can be found in appendix 1. More detailed information on the methodology is included in appendix 2.

DEFENSE CONTRACTS


- A Defense Contracts refers to U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) spending through contracts during fiscal year (FY) 2016 (i.e., October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016). All contract data are from USASpending.gov and include prime awards the DoD made to private and public-sector contractors adjusted for the period of performance and subawards that prime award recipients provided to sub-contractors in the fiscal year.
- proportions of total prime award spending in a state that went to four product and service categories: construction; research and development; services; and supplies and equipment. The DoD's Procurement and Acquisition Policy was used to categorize spending on the products and services identified by the product service code listed in each prime award record. Sub-award data are not included in this statistic as such records do not contain a code or any other product or service identifier.
- **Defense Contracts, By Service** is the percentage of defense contract spending that was contracted or funded by the Military Services or other DoD activities in a state or the District of Columbia. These figures include prime awards and sub-awards since both records have fields that identify the federal agency that contracted or funded the award.
- **D** Top Defense Contractors lists the private and public-sector vendors that were among the ten largest recipients of DoD spending in a state or the District of Columbia. These figures are adjusted to reflect the place of performance for prime and sub-awards, and the period of performance of the prime awards (see appendix 2 for details).
- **E** Contract Awards Performed by Fiscal Year represents the total defense contract awards in a state or the District of Columbia for each fiscal year from FY 2009

through FY 2016. These figures are adjusted to reflect the place of performance for prime and sub-awards, and the period of performance for prime awards (see appendix 2 for details).

AND DEFENSE PERSONNEL

- Pefense Personnel includes total active duty, civilian, National Guard, and Reserve personnel in a state or the District of Columbia during FY 2016 (i.e., from October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016).

 Defense payroll figures are the total gross pay received by those personnel in FY 2016. The states and counties refer to the duty locations for active duty and civilian personnel. National Guard and Reserve personnel figures are based on assigned locations. These data are from the DoD's Defense Manpower Data Center.
- **G** Allocations, By Type indicates the proportions of total defense personnel with an assigned or duty location in a state or the District of Columbia who were active duty, civilian, National Guard or Reserve personnel.
- Allocations, By Service represents a snapshot of the proportion of total defense personnel across the Military Services and other DoD activities with an assigned or duty location in a state or the District of Columbia on September 30, 2016.
- Total Payroll and Personnel is the total gross pay and count of all active duty, civilian, National Guard or Reserve personnel with an assigned or duty location in a state or the District of Columbia over the course of the fiscal year. Pension payments and other benefits are not included in the payroll figure.
- Top Defense Personnel Locations lists the ten counties with the highest numbers of defense personnel reported over FY 2016. Personnel numbers are not disclosed—indicated by "ND"—for counties in which the numbers of active duty, civilian, or total personnel are less than ten to protect those individuals' personally identifiable information.



- \$ Spent in State is the combined total of defense contract spending and defense personnel spending in a state or the District of Columbia during FY 2016. The ranking above this statistic indicates a state's placement among the 51 profiles.
- % of State GDP represents the combined total of defense contract and personnel spending as a proportion of a state or the District of Columbia's GDP in 2016. State GDP is the total value of all goods and services produced in a given year; these data are from the U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of Economic Analysis. The ranking above this statistic indicates a state's placement among the 51 profiles.
- % of Total U.S. Defense Spending is the combined total of defense contract and personnel spending in a state or the District of Columbia as a proportion of the DoD's contract and personnel spending in all 50 states and the District of Columbia in FY 2016.
- \$ per Resident highlights combined total defense contract and personnel spending in a state or the District of Columbia divided by the state's population. These population figures are June 2016 estimates by the U.S. Department of Commerce's Census Bureau.
- **Contract Spending** is the total amount the DoD spent on products and services in a state or the District of Columbia during FY 2016. The ranking above this statistic indicates a state's placement among the 51 profiles.
- P Number of Personnel indicates the total number of active duty, civilian, National Guard, or Reserve personnel with an assigned or duty location in a state or the District of Columbia during FY 2016. The ranking above this statistic indicates a state's placement among the 51 profiles.
- Personnel Spending totals the gross pay received by active duty, civilian, National Guard, or Reserve personnel with an assigned or duty location in a state or the District of Columbia during FY 2016. This figure does not include pension payments or other benefits. The ranking above this statistic indicates a state's placement among the 51 profiles.

TOP DEFENSE CONTRACT SPENDING LOCATIONS

R Top Defense Contract Spending Locations lists and shows the ten counties (or independent cities) in a state with the highest defense contract spending in FY 2016. For states with fewer than ten counties, all counties are identified. The District of Columbia is the only jurisdiction represented by a single location.

• TOP DEFENSE PERSONNEL SPENDING LOCATIONS

S Top Defense Personnel Spending Locations lists and shows the ten counties (or independent cities) within a state with the highest gross pay received by active duty, civilian, National Guard, or Reserve personnel during FY 2016. For states with fewer than ten counties, all counties are identified. The District of Columbia is the only jurisdiction represented by a single location.


Caveat for the Personnel Counts in this Report:

Readers are cautioned not to compare changes in personnel by county from the Defense Spending by State FY 2015 report to the FY 2016 report as the differences are likely due to changes in this report's source of personnel data. The researchers for the previous Defense Spending by State reports received 3-digit zip code data on the duty or assigned location of DoD personnel from DoD's Defense Manpower Data Center (DMDC). The researchers then approximated the county assignment of all DoD personnel as of the end of the fiscal year. This report reflects DMDC data for all personnel over the course of the fiscal year by county. More details on personnel data can be found in appendix 2.



By Service







APPENDIX 2: METHODOLOGY

This section contains additional details on the processes applied to derive the statistics provided in the state profiles throughout this report as well as information on the military installations depicted in the maps in those profiles.

A. Defense Contracts

This section refers to U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) spending through contracts during fiscal year (FY) 2016 (i.e., October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016). Personnel payroll, which is discussed in section F, is the only other type of defense spending included in this report.

This report analyzes contract spending because contracts are the principle method through which the DoD and other federal agencies spend money. The phrase "contract spending" reflects federal agencies' use of contracts with suppliers to purchase all products and services over a legally specified threshold, which was \$3,000 until July 2, 2015 and \$3,500 thereafter (federal agencies can use agency credit cards to buy products and services valued at less than those amounts). The DoD and other federal agencies obligate funds through other means, but those payments comprise a small percentage of the DoD's total expenditures.

Contract spending amounts are calculated from data obtained through USASpending.gov, a publicly available database of unclassified federal spending information maintained by the U.S. Department of the Treasury. All of the nearly 10 million spending records the researchers downloaded from USASpending.gov for this report listed the DoD as the "contracting agency," and most of those records (99.6%) also listed the DoD as the "funding agency." Contract spending amounts are reported as obligations rather than actual expenditures and comprise two types of data in this report:

- Prime awards that federal agencies provide to private and public-sector organizations and individuals for products (e.g., clothing and ships) and services (e.g., information technology and research and development), and
- Sub-awards that prime award recipients provide to sub-contractors.⁶

Contract spending figures in this report have not been adjusted for inflation. Contract data have been adjusted to reliably reflect the location and fiscal year in which the spending occurred.

Prime and Sub-Award Reporting

Steps were taken to ensure the prime and sub-award data are accurately reported. In cases where a prime contractor gave a sub-contract to another vendor, the sub-contract amount was subtracted from the prime contractor's total as well as the state and county in which the prime contractor was located. Moreover, the amount was added to the sub-contractor's total and the spending for the state and county in which the subcontractor was located.

County Locations for Defense Spending

Federal contract records do not list the county in which the majority of contracted products or services are performed or produced, but do list the congressional district, state, and zip code.⁷ As such, zip codes listed in the award records were used to estimate the counties in which the spending occurred. Zip codes for the "primary place of

performance" were used for prime contracts and subcontracts.

Fiscal Years for Contract Spending

The report incorporates two different methods for assigning prime and sub-awards to a particular fiscal year. Many federal procurement contracts are multi-year awards, with a contract signed in one fiscal year extending over multiple fiscal years. For this analysis, the "signed date" and "current completion date" listed in a prime contract record were used to determine the number of days in the contract's lifespan, the proportion of those days in each fiscal year, and the corresponding proportion of spending in each fiscal year.

For example, a prime contract with a signed date of November 1, 2015 and a current completion date of April 28, 2016 would have 100 percent of its 179-day contract lifespan in FY 2016; thus, 100 percent of its spending would be allocated to that fiscal year. By contrast, a prime contract with a signed date of November 1, 2015 and a current completion date of April 28, 2017 would have a 544-day lifespan, with 61.4 percent of those days in FY 2016 and 38.6 percent in FY 2017. Therefore, 61.4 percent and 38.6 percent of the spending would be allocated to FY 2016 and FY 2017, respectively.

A different approach was used to allocate sub-award funds to fiscal years because, unlike prime award records, sub-awards do not list the beginning and end of a sub-award's period of performance. The only date field is "sub-award fiscal year," which is the fiscal year in which a prime award recipient contracts a sub-awardee. As a result, sub-award spending was allocated to the fiscal year listed in the sub-award record. Many sub-award records had large, erroneous spending amounts that necessitated revision or removal from the dataset.

B. Defense Contracts, By Type

This measure represents the proportions of total prime award spending in a state or the District of Columbia that went to four product and service categories: construction; research and development; services; and supplies and equipment. The DoD's Procurement and Acquisition

Policy was used to categorize spending on the products and services identified by the product service code listed in each prime award record. The federal government uses these codes to identify the products or services that comprise the majority of spending in a prime award contract.

Sub-award records—which are created and maintained by the prime award recipients—do not contain a code or any other product or service identifier. Therefore, this statistic only reflects prime award expenditures.

C. Defense Contracts, By Service

This statistic is the percentage of defense contract spending in a state or the District of Columbia that was contracted or funded by the Military Services or other DoD activities in FY 2016. The "Contracting Office Agency ID" field in prime award records and the "Prime Award Funding Agency Name" in sub-awards records were used to identify the specific agency that contracted or funded an award. All awards identifying the U.S. Departments of the Army, Navy, and Air Force were categorized as "Army," "Navy/Marines," and "Air Force." All other DoD activities, such as the Defense Health Agency and Defense Logistics Agency, are categorized as "Other Defense."

D. Top Defense Contractors

This list includes the private- and public-sector vendors that were among the ten biggest recipients of DoD spending in a state or the District of Columbia during FY 2016. The researchers used unique nine-digit codes called DUNS numbers to identify both the prime and sub-award contractors.⁸ If a parent company was listed in the contract records, the researchers applied the corresponding DUNS number. If no parent company DUNS number was recorded, the researchers used the numbers for the individual vendors or sub-awardees.

E. Contract Award Performed, By Fiscal Year

These numbers represent total defense contract awards in a state or the District of Columbia for each fiscal year since 2009. Calculated according to the methodology described in Section A, these figures include both prime and subawards, and are often different from those listed in the FY

2015 version of this report. These differences reflect contract modifications (e.g., the addition/reduction of funds or an extension of the period of performance) that occurred after the data were obtained for the prior report and alternate formulas used by the researchers to make their calculations.

F. Defense Personnel

This section refers to the total active duty, civilian, National Guard, or Reserve personnel in a state or the District of Columbia during FY 2016. Like the FY 2015 report, these figures come from the DoD's Defense Manpower Data Center, but the research teams received the data in different formats. This is reflected in the different personnel figures listed in the two reports. The present report draws from data reported at the county level. The FY 2015 report used data reported by three-digit zip codes⁹ and aggregated the figures from those codes to calculate the numbers by county. The data used in the FY 2015 report listed total personnel numbers as of the end of FY 2015 (i.e., September 30, 2015). By contrast, the personnel payroll and type data (active duty, civilian, National Guard, and Reserve) used in the FY 2016 report counts total personnel assigned to each county over all twelve months comprising FY 2016. A person who is assigned to a different county over the course of the year appears in the total for each county, with their gross pay proportionally represented in both.

Finally, this report counts individuals who were civilian personnel and who were in the Reserves or National Guard as two employees. The share of personnel by military service (Army, Navy/Marines, Air Force, Other Defense) is based on a different dataset provided by the DoD's Defense Manpower Data Center that reflects numbers as of the end of FY 2016 (September 30, 2016). It should be noted that personnel and payroll figures in this report are of limited comparability to the figures in the FY 2015 report.

G. Military Installations

The installations depicted in the maps throughout this report are drawn from the DoD's "Military Installations, Ranges, and Training Areas (MIRTA)" dataset. MIRTA contains geospatial data (i.e., latitude and longitude) on the point locations and boundaries of DoD facilities listed in the DoD's 2015 Base Structure Report. Points represent the centers or near-centers of DoD sites, and the boundaries comprise federally owned or managed land. The dataset is in shapefile format, a common format for geographic information systems, and conforms to the World Geodetic System 1984, a frequently used terrestrial reference system that is referred to as "WGS84." The data are in decimal degrees. Many facilities in the MIRTA dataset include subordinate sites, and, for various reasons, not all military installations are included.¹⁰
