INTRODUCTION

This report presents the results of an analysis of U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) contract, grant, and personnel spending during fiscal year (FY) 2022. The report's graphs and tables present a range of findings, such as total spending figures, categories of contracted goods and services, major defense vendors, and numbers and types of defense personnel. Territory officials may use this information to assess a region's dependence on defense spending and to target assistance to support more resilient communities and companies.

Conducted in late 2023, the analysis primarily entailed an examination of DoD-funded primeand sub-award contract data and defense personnel and payroll figures. This report also marks the first time that DoD-funded grant prime and sub-grant awards have been incorporated into the territory-level analysis of total defense spending. Findings are drawn from an array of sources, including the DoD's Defense Manpower Data Center and USAspending.gov, which is managed by the U.S. Department of the Treasury.

FY 2022 Overview

The DoD's budget authority increased from \$719.5 billion in FY 2021 to \$795.7 billion in FY 2022.¹ DoD contract obligations, grant obligations, and payroll spending in the 50 states and the District of Columbia totaled \$558.7 billion. Contract obligations, grant obligations, and payroll spending in American Samoa, Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands totaled \$3.8 billion. Contracts for various products and services totaled \$2.4 billion in those five territories, while DoD personnel payroll accounted for \$1.3 billion, and DoD grant spending accounted for \$57.0 million.

Most contract funds went to construction (43 percent) and services (39 percent), with supplies and equipment (such as aircraft, ships, weapons, and parts; 17 percent) and research and development (<1 percent) comprising the remainder. The largest portion of personnel pay was for active-duty military (41 percent), followed by civilians (25 percent), the National Guard (22 percent), and the Reserves (12 percent). Grant awards for FY 2022 were analyzed at the territory level only.

Total defense spending (contracts, grants and payroll) ranged from \$4.8 million in American Samoa to \$2.5 billion in Guam. This comprised 36.6 percent of Guam's Gross Domestic Product (GDP), the highest of any U.S. state or territory. Among the 50 States and DC, defense spending as a share of GDP averaged 2.2 percent in FY 2022 and was highest in Virginia, at 9.7 percent.






















L DEFENSE PERSONNEL






