

- + \$40M for DCIP + 50M for DCIP = \$100M total
 - Allows for the installation of air conditioning under Noise Mitigation Program

House

- Make DCIP permanent
- Adds insular areas to DCIP match wavier
- Requires study on childcare development centers and DCIP
- Reduces authorized funding by \$10M


Senate

- Coast Guard facilities eligible for DCIP
- Technical assistance to communities potentially affected by releases at current and former DOD sites
- Assistance to Local Educational Agencies that benefit dependents with enrollment changes due to base closures, force structure changes, or force relocations – B-21



FY23 EXECUTION - 73 Grants (\$168.1M)



Defense Community Infrastructure Pilot Program

- 65 projects \$300M in federal funding leveraging over \$251M in other funding for over \$550M in total infrastructure enhancements
- Work Proposals Now!
 - Write to the FY23 Notice of Funding
 - Write to military value
 - Prevailing wage rate and the installation of utilities that are energy efficient
 - Defense Critical Infrastructure
 - Build America, Buy America Act
- Importance of military endorsement letter
- Understand NEPA and what to do
- Ensure non-OLDCC federal funding is obligated

Installation Resilience

- Partner with your installation to plan, enhance infrastructure, and implement measures that contribute to maintaining or improving military installation resilience primarily due to climate threats
- 22 existing projects + 30 nominees = \$?
- Look beyond the obvious "you don't know what you don't know"
- Metrics think about who is being affected and dependencies (entire community population)
- Table top exercise gauge hard + soft infrastructure needs with stakeholders
 - ✓ Understand public infrastructure and services defense critical infrastructure (energy, water, cyber, hardening, etc.)
 - ✓ Include transportation, housing, education, and health care

Defense Manufacturing Community Support Program

- Hiatus in Fiscal Year 2024
- \$110M in federal funding leveraging \$44M in matching funds and \$289M in additional funding across 23 Defense Manufacturing Communities with support from over 478 partners
 - Over 3,632 companies assisted
 - 433 companies increased cybersecurity maturity levels
 - 52 new defense technologies/products developed
 - 109 existing defense technologies/ products improved
 - 22405 defense manufacturing jobs created
 - 11,345 defense manufacturing jobs saved

Public Schools on Military Installations

- No invites for schools in Fiscal Year 2024
- Actively working proposals from schools through #71 from the Secretary's priority list
- To date, program has received \$3.25B in funding from Congress
 - \$1.3B obligated across 34 schools
 - \$1.87B available allocated for 32 school proposals
 - Encouraging Net-Zero designs

Community Noise Mitigation

- Public comments through mid-October 45 comments received
- \$75 million program to reduce the impact of fixed wing military aviation noise on "covered" facilities near certain military installations
 - \$56.25 million active military installations
 - \$18.75 million reserve component installations
 - \$5 million communities near military installations that have transitioned to a new type of aircraft after January 1, 2019
- Awaiting FY24 appropriations
 - Language on air conditioning
 - May split guard and reserve installations into a separate competition



Fiscal Year 2022 Defense Spending by State Report

- Opportunity to understand the DoD footprint
- FY22: \$558.7B spent across the country, accounting for 2.2% of our gross domestic product
- \$9.7B spent in grants & \$390.5B in contracts





- Contracts do not necessarily reflect place of performance
- Data presented as reported in USASpending.gov
- Important for state and local organizations to dig into the details on Defense supply chain and personnel information


